Citizenship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Obey laws and rules - Respect authority - Protect the environment - Care about and pursue common good 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - There are park rules as well as camp rules you should follow - Keep the park clean – maybe you didn't through the trash on the ground but it won't hurt you to help pick it up - Do not use alcohol - The common good at camp is the welfare and enjoyment of the campers
